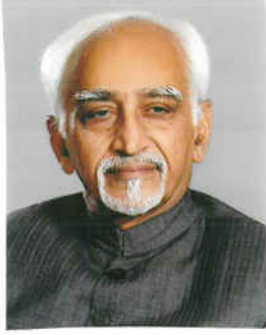

I extend my greetings to all those associated in this and convey my wishes for a successful Vigilance Week and hope our country becomes corruption free.

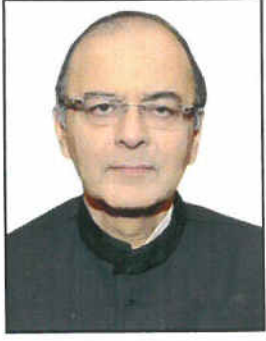

Subject:- Observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2016.

Central Vigilance Commission, as the apex integrity institution of the country, endeavours to promote integrity, transparency and accountability in public life. Observance of Vigilance Awareness Week every year is one such outreach measure wherein all the stake holders are encouraged to prevent and combat corruption. The Commission has decided that this year the Vigilance Awareness Week would be observed from 31st October to 5th November, 2016 with the theme "**Public participation in promoting Integrity and eradicating Corruption**".

2. Corruption is a serious unethical practice that undermines trust and confidence in public officials and public confidence can only be gained by integrity in governance. Economic and social progress, rule of law, democratic values and a strong civil society are some of the basic prerequisites in building an integrity system to sustain the fight against corruption in society. In order to attain a corruption free society, all stake holders including government, citizens and also the private sector must share the responsibility for creation of awareness of corruption as well as refrain from indulging in unethical acts.

3. Aware, active, involved and empowered public is, therefore, essential to any anti-corruption campaign. Anti-corruption strategies are not simply policies that can be planned in advance and isolation, but often a set of subtler insights that can be developed only in conjunction with public participation. Combating corruption is, therefore, not just a matter of making laws and creating institutions, but is deeply rooted in human values and morals of individuals and the fight against corruption cannot be won without citizens' support, participation and active vigilance by all concerned. The Commission has, therefore, chosen "Public participation in promoting Integrity and eradicating Corruption" as the central theme for Vigilance Awareness Week, 2016.

4. The observance of the Vigilance Awareness Week would commence with the pledge (copy enclosed) by public servants in the Ministries/Departments/CPSEs/Public Sector Banks and all other Organisations on 31st October, 2016 at 11.00 a.m. All the organisations are also advised to consider activities relevant to the theme both within

their organization as well as for outreach for public/citizens during the Vigilance Awareness Week as below:-

A. Activities to be conducted within the organization:

- A1. Distribute pamphlets, handouts on preventive vigilance activities / whistle blower mechanism and other anti-corruption measures.
- A2. Workshops/sensitization programmes for employees and other stake holders on policies/procedures of the organization and preventive vigilance measures.
- A3. Bring out special issue of journals/newsletters on vigilance issues / systemic improvements and good practices adopted for wider dissemination and awareness.
- A4. Conduct various competitions such as debates, quiz etc. for the employees and their families on issues relating to anti-corruption;
- A5. Use organizational website for dissemination of employees/customer oriented information and avenues available for grievance redressal.

B. Outreach activities for public/citizens:

- B1. Display of hoardings, banners, posters and distribution of handouts etc. at prominent locations/places in offices/field units and also at places with public interface (eg. Branches of Banks, Petrol Pumps, Railway Stations, Airports etc.).
- B2. Organize customer grievance redressal camps for citizens/customers/vendors/contractors, etc. by organisations having customer oriented services/activities. It is expected that such camps are held by the organisations not only at headquarters but also at all appropriate field offices across the country.
- B3. Organize debates/elocution/essay writing/cartoon/poster competitions on moral values, ethics, good governance practices etc. amongst the youth/students of schools/colleges including professional colleges/institutions and to distribute prizes. Alternatively, panel discussions or lectures can also be organized with the students.

As in previous year, for creation of awareness on the ill-effects of corruption in college and school students, the Commission desires that special efforts may be made by each field unit/branch of every CPSE/PSB/Organisation to organize activities in at least 2 schools and 3 colleges in every city/town. An action plan with details of cities to be covered will be communicated to the CVOs separately.

- B5. Organise "awareness gram sabhas" for dissemination of awareness in Gram Panchayats (in rural and semi-urban areas) to sensitise citizens on ill-effects of corruption. This activity would largely be taken up by the Public Sector Banks which will ask each of their branches to conduct such awareness gram sabhas in atleast two Gram Panchayats. Similar sabhas / meetings could be organized at the district level also by the lead Bank of the district. Detailed action plan for this activity will be communicated separately to the CVOs of the PSBs.
- B6. Ensure participation of non-government organisations, corporates in private sector, other institutions, service organisations and public in the local area to participate in the vigilance awareness campaigns particularly by conducting seminars/workshops/skits/street plays/walk/marathon etc. Vigilance Study Circles may also ensure organizing such activities.
- B7. Use social media, electronic and print media for spreading awareness etc.

5. The Commission expects all concerned to organize and conduct the various activities with zeal and enthusiasm to achieve the objective of the theme this year for public participation in spreading awareness of corruption, its ill-effects and in the fight against corruption.

6. A report on the observance of the Week may be sent to Central Vigilance Commission by 30th November, 2016 by all Ministries/Departments/Organisations.

Subject:- Observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2016.


Central Vigilance Commission had through its circular of even number dated. 19.09.2016 issued instructions for observance of Vigilance Awareness Week this year, from 31st October to 5th November, 2016. The theme for the Week is "Public participation in promoting Integrity and eradicating Corruption".

2. In addition to the activities suggested by the Commission to be conducted within the organisations as well as the outreach activities for public/citizens, in line with the theme this year, to create greater awareness and participation of the public at large, the Commission has envisaged a concept of "Integrity Pledge". As such two Integrity Pledges have been envisaged enlisting support and commitment of the citizens and the other for corporates/entities/firms etc., especially in the private sector to prevent and combat corruption.

3. Both, the "Integrity Pledges" to be taken by individual citizens as well as by corporates, entities, firms etc., affirming their commitment to eradicate corruption and to uphold highest standards of ethical conduct, transparency and good governance would be available as an e-pledge on the Commission's website <http://www.cvc.nic.in>. All Ministries/Departments/Organisations may also provide a hyperlink to the Integrity Pledges on their respective websites/intranet to enable wider participation. Citizens and organisations taking the Integrity Pledge would be provided a certificate acknowledging and appreciating their commitment to the cause of anti-corruption. Copies of both the "Integrity Pledges" are enclosed.

4. The Commission requests all Ministries / Departments /Organisations to disseminate and publicise this initiative to elicit wider participation of all stakeholders and also to encourage their customers/public and corporates / entities/firms, etc., to take the Integrity Pledge.

Subject:- Observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2016.

Central Vigilance Commission had through its circulars of even number dated. 19.09.2016 and 23.09.2016 issued instructions for observance of Vigilance Awareness Week this year, from 31st October to 5th November, 2016. The theme for the Week is "**Public participation in promoting Integrity and eradicating Corruption**".

2. As a part of the activities suggested by the Commission to be conducted within the organisations as well as the outreach activities for public/citizens, in line with the theme this year, the Commission desires that concerted efforts be made to reach out to the college and school students who have an important role to play in promoting integrity as well as in eradication of corruption.

3. During the Vigilance Awareness Week last year, competitions and activities for college and school students were conducted by various organisations on a grand scale reaching out to about 1600 colleges and 2300 schools in over 400 towns/cities across the country. Encouraged by the response of the activities held last year, the Commission desires that this year also, all organisations may conduct various activities such as lectures, panel discussions, debates, quiz, essay writing, slogans and poster competitions on moral values, ethics, good governance practices, etc. for inculcating greater awareness on corruption and anti-corruption measures for ensuring active participation of students of colleges / schools including professional colleges / institutions across the country and also to distribute prizes.

4. The Commission would, therefore, request all CPSEs / Public Sector Banks, Public Sector Insurance Companies and other organisations to organise activities as aforesaid in at least 3 colleges and 2 schools in every city / town wherever the individual organisation has substantial presence / operational offices / field offices / branches. An indicative list of cities / towns, etc., for coverage across the country by the Organisations concerned is enclosed as Annex-A and B. The list is only an indicative one, and organisations are free to cover and conduct activities in as many schools and colleges in towns / cities.

5. The Commission desires that the CVOs of the Organisations to coordinate and conduct the activities so as to reach out to a large cross-section of students / youth across the country.

Subject:- Observance of Vigilance Awareness Week, 2016.

Central Vigilance Commission had through its circulars of even number dated. 19.09.2016, 23.09.2016 and 26.09.2016 issued instructions for observance of Vigilance Awareness Week this year, from 31st October to 5th November, 2016. The theme for the Week is "**Public participation in promoting Integrity and eradicating Corruption**".

2. As part of the activities suggested by the Commission to be conducted within the organisations as well as the outreach activities for public / citizens, it was advised that the public sector banks would organise "Awareness Gram Sabhas" for dissemination of awareness in Gram Panchayats to sensitise citizens on the ill effects of corruption (reg. para 4 – B5 of Commission's circular dated 19/09/2016). This activity is required to be largely taken up by the Public Sector Banks and their sponsored Regional Rural Banks (RRBs) through their network of branches. It is expected that each Branch of the Public Sector Bank/RRB will organise the "Awareness Gram Sabhas" in at least two Gram Panchayats during the Vigilance Awareness Week between 31st October and 5th November, 2016. At the district level also, similar sabhas / meetings could be organised by Public Sector Banks especially, by the lead bank of the district.

3. The Commission desires that the CVOs along with the CMD or his nominee hold a meeting / video conference with the Heads of their Circle and Regional Offices, Chairman of RRBs, Vigilance Managers and Vigilance Officers to enable successful implementation of the "Awareness Gram Sabhas". The Head of the Office / Regional Office (or of the Circle if there are no Regional Offices) would function as the Nodal Officer for this activity.

4. The Nodal Officer would instruct all Branch Managers of the PSB / RRB to organise various activities like meetings for creation of awareness on corruption and its ill effects, educating citizens on grievance redressal options available and also organise competitions/melas/ night choupals/cultural programmes as part of the "Awareness Gram Sabhas". The Commission expects that all stake holders like the Sarpanch, members of the Gram Panchayat, Self-Help Groups (SHGs), workers of

MGNREGA, farmers, students and citizens be actively involved in this outreach activity.

5. In order to ensure that the above outreach activities are conducted in a coordinated & focused manner and to achieve maximum coverage across the country, the Commission has prepared an action plan for guidance of all concerned officials of Public Sector Banks / RRBs as at Annex-A.

6. The Commission desires that the CVOs of the Public Sector Banks would coordinate and conduct the above outreach activities to cover rural and semi-urban areas and also at the district level in their respective banks.

Action Plan for conducting “Awareness Gram Sabhas” in rural and semi-urban areas

The following is a list of indicative activities for conducting “Awareness Gram Sabhas”, however the 1st activity of organising meeting is mandatory.

- (1) Organise meetings in Gram Panchayats inviting all stake holders, like the Sarpanch, members of Gram Panchayat, Self-Help Groups (SHGs), workers of MGNREGA, farmers, students, and citizens. Head of Gram Sabha /Sarpanch or any dignitary could be requested to deliver lecture on awareness against corruption followed by discussion. Anti-Corruption messages in vernacular languages can also be displayed at the meeting.
- (2) Organise competitions like quiz, cartoon, slogans, painting, rangoli and posters.
- (3) Organise Melas to give wide publicity to the produce / products of the SHGs as motivational tools for integrating them with awareness creation effort.
- (4) Organise evening Choupals / meetings in villages / panchayats during which short plays/ nautankies / kalajathas / folk songs / puppet shows, etc., can be organised focusing on the theme of Anti-Corruption.
